



THE BUNGEE EFFECT

What is the "Bungee Effect'?

For those members it is what happens when you happen to be on a ride and you end up down the back day dreaming or thinking how great it is to be out riding a motorcycle and not keeping up with the group.

When you are on short club rides it does not have too much effect or consequences apart from being left behind or missing a turn because the 2nd rider has not dropped off and the other riders have got away from you. In town or in heavy traffic and at traffic lights it does lead to riders getting split up and getting misplaced (Lost).

On Long Distance Rides (LDR's) it does have some significant effect and riders need to be mindful of it and to keep up with the pack. Our past experience of the "Bungee Effect" on LDR's is that it causes a severe increase in fuel usage as the rider is continually speeding up to catch up and then inadvertently drops back again and then has to speed up to catch up again, On one ride we actually saw one rider use twice as much fuel as identical bikes on the ride. We quickly cured this by mandating that the rider rode up the front until he got used to long distance riding techniques.

On another ride a rider copped a Traffic Infringement for speeding when the Bungee Effect took over and he was doing catch up.

It can and does also have an effect on the Lead Rider of a LDR as he usually is continually counting headlights in his mirrors to see that the ride is still together and no one has come off.

So riders please be aware of the "Bungee Effect" and take the necessary steps to make sure it doesn't get you.




TRIUMPH TRAILBLAZER 250

The 1971 Triumph Trail Blazer appeared to most to be just about the perfect weekend warrior. The single cylinder 250 never really caught on when it was released in 1971. So now they are quite rare and tend to be viewed as collectibles. As with many British bikes of the era the Trail Blazers had some relatively significant mechanical issues, they were famous for detonating their gearboxes at wildly inopportune times. The clutch was a temperamental as an old lady's cats and the engine vibration in the upper rev range was known to shake people into an early onset of Parkinson's.

Despite these short comings, the bike remains popular with vintage off road enthusiasts. There are little communities dotted across Brit-

Royal Enfield Himalayan's Production Starts in India

The new product from Royal Enfield will be an Adventure Tourer the Himalayan, upon its launch it could be positioned below the Continental GT. The company has in fact started production of the bike in the country. This hints at the Indian market launch is near. The Royal Enfield Himalayan will face competition from the bikes like Bajaj AS150 and AS200. In India.

The Himalayan will be the first Royal Enfield to feature mono shock suspension (rear), while the front gets telescopic forks. The telescopic forks covered with fork gaiters, safeguard the fork seats from dust and other unwanted elements. The adventure tourer sits on a modified single tube chassis that also underpins the other RE bikes. It offers an upright and comfortable riding position that further improves riding experience on long runs.

According to reports, the Himalayan will be powered with an all new 410cc, single-cylinder engine that is expected to be a bored out version of the 350cc motor. The power plant is expected to produce an estimated power of 29bhp with a peak torque of 40Nm. Transmitting power to the rear wheel via chain drive will be a 5-speed gear box. It is expected to return fuel efficiency around 40kmpl – 45kmpl. Expected in Australia sometime 2016.



Four decades ago, Peter Williams won the 1973 Isle of Man F750 TT on a motorcycle of his own design, lapping at 107.27 mph not far off Mike Hailwood's 1967 outright record on a works Honda. Not bad on an air-cooled, Norton Commando engine.

Always an innovator, Williams claims credit for all sorts of modern motorcycle design elements including disc brakes, cast wheels and twinbeam frames.

To commemorate that epic win, *Peter Williams Motorcycles* is now taking orders for replicas of that very distinctive TT-winning John

Player Norton; only 25 monocoqueframed Commandos will be built. The stainless-steel chassis that formed fuel tank and frame lent the bike its "monocoque" name. The new replicas will follow the layout of the 1973 bikes, the main difference



Engines will be built by renowned Norton specialist, Mick Hemmings, using all-new parts, including Peter's own cam design. The replicas will feature a host of bespoke parts such as cast magnesium wheels and forks created from the original '70s drawings. Where drawings were not available, the company says new parts have been created by referencing and digitizing two of the original race bikes.

The PWM replicas in 2013 you needed £65,000 to procure one, about \$100,000 at the current exchange rate. (PWM says the four original bikes are valued at over £250,000—too expensive to risk riding, really.) (2013 Article)
